About the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) Individual Fellowships



What is it?

MSCA - Individual Fellowships are an opportunity for researchers of any nationality to work in research labs in Europe for up to two years.

Who can apply?

The Individual Fellowships are awarded to the most promising researchers of any nationality who want to benefit from advanced training in Europe. Applicants either hold a PhD degree or have at least four years of full-time equivalent research experience.

Which research topics are supported?

Any research field may qualify for MSCA-IF funding.

How does it work?

Proposals are submitted jointly – by you as the researcher and a "host" organization in Europe. You, the researcher, will develop the proposal in cooperation with a European organization that would be willing to host you. Host organizations can be universities, research centers or companies.

What does the funding cover?

The grant provides €4650/month (monthly allowance, adjusted by country, plus a mobility allowance of €600/month and a family allowance of €500/month), In addition, the EU contributes to the training, networking and research costs of the fellow, as well as to the management and indirect costs of the project. The grant is awarded to the host organization, usually a university, research center or a company in Europe.

When does the call open and when is the deadline?

The Call for proposals opened on 12 April 2018 and has a deadline of 12 September 2018.

About the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) Research & Innovation Staff Exchange (RISE)



What is it?

MSCA-RISE aims at international and inter-sector collaboration through promoting research and innovation exchanges of staff. MSCA-RISE will support short-term mobility of research and innovation staff at all career levels, from the most junior (post-graduate) to the most senior (management), including administrative and technical staff.

Who can apply?

MSCA-RISE is open to partnerships of universities, research institutions, and non-academic organisations both within and beyond Europe. Universities, research institutes can apply, not individuals. ASEAN universities, research institutes, and companies are eligible.

Why should I apply?

You can expand and strengthen your network and gain new expertise. You and your European partners can share knowledge and skills, and broaden the career development of your staff, and you can strengthen your institutional links with Europe.

Which research topics are supported?

Any research field may qualify for MSCA-RISE.

How does it work?

An MSCA-RISE partnership is composed of at least three independent participants established in three different countries. An ASEAN university, research institute or company would need to partner with organisation in *at least* 2 European countries to propose a joint research and innovation project. Proposals should highlight networking opportunities, sharing of knowledge and the skills development of staff members.

When does the call open and when is the deadline?

The Call for proposals is due to open in December 2018 with a deadline of April 2019.
